Terry Hopson dropped a goal and scored a brilliant try for Gloucester, with Don Rutherford making the conversion and kicking two penalty goals. But, you may recall, Rutherford hit the cross-bar with another penalty shot, while Tony Osman knocked over the corner flag when crossing for what would otherwise have been a fine try.

While Don Rutherford's broken arm – an unhappy "relic" of the Lions' tour – is mending nicely, as we say, news of our other two injured stalwarts is not so good. Terry Hopson, also nursing a broken arm, is now likely to be out of the game for at least two months, much longer than at first thought, while John Bayliss, though having dispensed with crutches, is still limping badly and prospects of his early return are far from rosy.

All of which is tough, too, on the County selectors, who will shortly be selecting the side to meet Monmouthshire at Newport on Tuesday evening, October 4th.
