This afternoon we accord a very special welcome to Oxford University, who pay us the tribute of regarding their visit to Kingsholm as one of the most formidable tests they could have wished for prior to their "big occasion" next Tuesday week, when they meet Cambridge University at Twickenham.

and enjoyable game this afternoon.

Last season, on October 29th, the Dark Blues beat Gloucester at Iffley Road by 9 points to 3, our points coming from a dropped goal by Gary Mace. Oxford University's last visit to Kingsholm was on October 30th, 1965, when Gloucester won by 14 points to 3, thanks mainly to Don Rutherford's place kicking. He landed three penalty goals and converted a try by Dave Owen.

Hearty congratulations go to our own Charlie Hannaford on his selection for the Light Blues in the Varsity match. Our visitors this afternoon will no doubt forgive us for being a little partisan when we express the hope that Charlie plays a "stormer" against them!

The holder of the lucky programme, No. 701, for the St. Luke's College match on Wednesday evening was Mr. R. Wood of Stinchcombe, who was the richer by £5. Congratulations!

Supporters are reminded that there is another floodlight match at Kingsholm next Wednesday, December 6th, when Clifton will be our visitors. This was the match originally arranged for October 12th, so members will be able to use their season tickets for this game.

Next Saturday our visitors to Kingsholm will be Bath, kick-off 3-15. Unfortunately Gloucester will be without their County players as on this date Gloucestershire play their re-arranged county championship match with Devon at Bristol.
