Many supporters will already have seen some of the St. Luke's players in action, for they showed their skills and prowess in that lively Devon three-quarter line that gave Gloucestershire plenty to think about in the county championship match here recently.

Last season's game with the College, played on Wednesday evening, November 27th, 1968, ended in a draw of 9 points each, though it was not until the dying minutes that Tom Palmer gave Gloucester the equaliser with a dropped goal.

Palmer also landed a penalty goal, while Gary White scored an unconverted try.

Congratulations to Gloucestershire on winning the South-West group title with that resounding victory over Somerset at Bridgwater last Saturday.

The County again gave a terrific display, with the Gloucester lads all playing leading parts, and whichever county wins the Southern group there could be a triple play-off there!—none of them will relish meeting Gloucestershire in this form in the quarter-final.

The first draw in the "200 Club" has been made and Gloucester players figure prominently among the winners. First prize of £25 went to Roy Morris, with No. 58. Four prizes of £5 each were won by John Dix (No. 85), Jim Jarrett (No. 145), Miss M. Goddard (No. 4), and Peter Day (No. 134).
