This evening we extend a cordial welcome to Moseley, always popular visitors to Kingsholm; a club that we regard as one of the "musts" to watch in our diaries of rugger events. We look forward, then, to another spectacular game with our old friends from "Brum".

KINGSHOLM KACKLE

Earlier this season, on Saturday, November 8th—a County match date—a weakened Gloucester side brought surprise and joy to their supporters by accomplishing a remarkable victory over Moseley at the Reddings by 17 points to 14.

Richard Jardine, Dave Brooks and John Spalding scored tries, with Jardine also dropping a goal and Spalding kicking one penalty goal and making a conversion.

On their meeting at Kingsholm last season, on Saturday, September 7th, 1968, Gloucester and Moseley shared a draw of 8 points each. Spalding was again on the score-sheet, scoring the only try for Gloucester, with Eric Stephens adding the goal points and landing a penalty goal.

Moseley's redoubtable "boot", has notched 362 points this season. Actually, his total before this evening's match is 361 points—only one astray, it is true, and a formidable total! But when pending records are in the offing, it is necessary for statistics to be accurate. Sam, however, has been officially informed that 361 is the correct total.

But Gloucester supporters will hope that he is not given too many chances this evening to "take it from there"!

Gloucester do not have another home game until next Monday week, April 20th, when they have their local "derby" with Cheltenham. Next Monday, however, there is an attractive fixture for United, who meet Newport United at Kingsholm (kick-off 7 p.m.).

There is also a further feast of local cup rugger for the ardent enthusiasts. On Monday evening Spartans are home to Matson in the semi-final of the North Gloucestershire Combination Senior Cup, while the other semi-final is next Wednesday at the Oxleaze, where Gloucester All Blues face an equally formidable task with the visit of Gordon League. Both games kick-off at 6 p.m.

The two Junior semi-finals are next Tuesday, but at the time of going to press, as it were, the actual contestants were not known, as there was a replay last night. However, these Junior semi-finals will be announced in the local press.
