In the corresponding match last year, on Wednesday evening, October 1st, 1969, Gloucester defeated Ebbw Vale by 15 points to 11. But they owed their success almost entirely to Eric Stephens, who landed four penalty goals, with Terry Hopson scoring the unconverted try.

Next Saturday, October 10th, there is the eagerly awaited game between the Western Counties (Gloucestershire and Somerset) and the brilliant Fijians at Kingsholm (kick-off 3.15 p.m.). Such has been the interest aroused that all stand tickets have been sold.

However, club members and supporters are reminded that it is not an all-ticket match, though to avoid waiting in queues before the game they are advised to obtain those tickets still available as soon as possible.

These tickets are: Ringside 10/6, Enclosure 7/6, Ground 5/-. They may be obtained at the office on the ground, the Social Club, or from Hudson & Co., Sports Outfitters, Northgate Street, Gloucester.

Another reminder! Those members intending to visit Twickenham for England's home international matches this season should make application for tickets before October 24th to the Gloucester R.F.C. secretary, Harold King, 126, Podsmead Road, Gloucester, enclosing the relevant remittance and a stamped addressed envelope.

Prices of tickets are: Stand 31/-; Ringside 10/6; Enclosure 6/6; Ground 5/6. (All these prices are inclusive of booking fees).

This evening's game is Gloucester's last at Kingsholm until Saturday, October 24th, but supporters will not have far to travel to cheer on the lads next Wednesday evening, October 14th, for then Gloucester meet neighbouring Stroud at Fromehall Park.

The kick-off time will be announced in the Press, but it is likley to be as early as 5 p.m. as there are no floodlights, of course, at the park.
