The danger men in the Gloucester side are wingers Bob Clewes and Eric Stephens, one scores the tries and the other kicks the goals—Eric Stephens has scored over 200 points this season mainly from penalties and conversions. But Gloucester are not just a two man band; at inside half Mickey Booth is a skilled and experienced player, while hooker Mike Nicholls and line out expert Nigel Jackson are forwards who are in fine form.

This afternoon Swansea have the opportunity of becoming the first Welsh side to defeat Gloucester this season.

The Gloucester record reads:—Won 21, Drawn 2, Lost 7. Points For 462, Against 237. Last season at the Kingsholme ground, Gloucester won by 19 points to 3.

With the inclusion of several Youth internationals in the Swansea side, it is interesting to note that this year's Chairman, Mr. Will Lang, was a pioneer of Youth rugby in Wales. He started a youth team at Gorseinon with such success that the movement spread and this led to the formation of the Welsh Youth Rugby Union 22 years ago. It must give Will immense satisfaction that in his year of office so many Youth players have come to Swansea and are being coached by leuan Evans, who of course is also in charge of the Welsh Youth team.
