## **OUR VISITORS**

Kingsholm supporters cannot deny that Gloucester have kept many of the good things in rugger until late in the season and this continues with the visit of our old and valued Welsh friends—and formidable rivals—Cardiff, to whom we extend a particularly cordial welcome this afternoon.

Unfortunately, over the past few years, the famous Welshmen have only visited Kingsholm every other season, with the alternate match being played at the Arms Park. Last season Gloucester, though admittedly not at full strength, fell heavily at Welsh headquarters, where Cardiff won convincingly on the evening of Wednesday, September 3rd, by 22 points to 3, the Cherry and Whites' sole contribution to affairs being a penalty goal by John Spalding. On the last occasion that the two clubs met at Kingsholm, on Wednesday, September 25th, 1968, it will no doubt be recalled by many supporters that Gloucester beat Cardiff by 15 points to 6. It was a remarkable game in many ways insomuch as all the scoring came from a series of penalty goals by both sides, despite the fact that there were numerous entertaining and exciting moments. Eric Stephens landed five for Gloucester, with Dennis Gethin kicking two for Cardiff.
