Three matches at Kingsholm in the space of four days is indeed a feast of rugger, even for avid Gloucester enthusiasts ; but the excellent bill of fare continues with two more games next week, though on Wednesday it will mean the short journey over to Cheltenham, where Gloucester meet the Town at the Athletic Ground (kick-off 7 p.m.). Then it is back to Kingsholm next Saturday, when further formidable opponents, Newport, will be the visitors, kick-off as usual at 3.15 p.m.

Home international matches at Twickenham this season are against Wales on January 15th and Ireland on February 12th. Members wishing to go to either, or both, of these matches are reminded that applications for tickets must be made to the Gloucester R.F.C. secretary, Harold King, at 126 Podsmead Road, Gloucester, **not later than next Saturday, October 16th**, enclosing the necessary remittance.

And on the local scene, of course, as many of our supporters may know, Matson meet Lydney in this season's final of the Gloucestershire R.F.U. County Cup tomorrow, week, Sunday, October 17th, on their ground at Redwell Road, Matson. This should be quite a battle, as success for Matson over the present cup holders could put them in line for a place in next season's Rugby Union National Knock-out competition.
