WELCOME TO MOSELEY !

It has been unfortunate that for many years, because of the difficulty in arranging an alternative date, one of our two fixtures with Moseley, among the most formidable of our opponents, invariably falls on a County match day. However, this season the Gloucestershire selectors, strange though it may seem, have omitted to call upon several of our key players, and while seven of our regulars are on County duties Gloucester are still able to field a strong side against our Midland friends, to whom we extend a very cordial welcome this afternoon.

Moseley, of course, have deservedly earned the reputation over recent years of being one of the country's leading clubs ; one that insists, wherever possible, of playing constructive rugby, with the accent on running and handling, so we look forward to an entertaining game today. Last season the two teams met at Kingsholm on Wednesday evening, September 16th, 1970, with Gloucester winning an evenly contested game by 11 points to 6. Mike Bayliss, now with Cheltenham, John Haines and Robin Cowling scored tries for the Cherry and Whites, with Eric Stephens making one conversion, while Keith Fielding crossed for Moseley's two excellent unconverted tries.

While few will agree with the selectors' choice, we wish Gloucestershire every success in their match against Cornwall at the Recreation Ground, Redruth, this afternoon. With the Cornishmen constantly urged on by the fervent, rugby-crazy supporters on their own midden, particularly on "Hell-Fire Corner", the County lads face a truly tough task in their bid to win group honours yet again.

Congratulations to Ron Etheridge on being selected for what is virtually a Scottish trial ; all supporters sincerely wish him luck and hope he will go even further to win his cap, even if it is for the "auld enemy". With several other players having been carefully watched by England selectors, maybe at long last Gloucester will be able to boast of having internationals in their ranks !

Gloucester face two more extremely stiff hurdles next week, commencing with the journey across country on Wednesday to meet Cambridge University at Grange Road. This is followed by the away game with Aberavon next Saturday, when United will be home to Ebbw Vale Athletic, kick-off 3.15 p.m. Gloucester's next match at Kingsholm is in a fortnight's time, Saturday, November 27th, when Lydney will be the visitors, the kick-off as usual, at 3.15 p.m., though on that day Gloucestershire have their third match in the South-Western group when they meet Devon at Bristol.
