PROGRAMME NOTES (by W. A. D. LAWRIE)

This afternoon we extend a very warm welcome to GLOUCESTER, paying their second post-war visit to the Brewery Field.

Before our game at Gloucester on the 30th January, 1971, we had previously visited Kingsholm in the 1965/66 season, losing by 6 points to 3.

Prior to 1965/66, we were at Kingsholm twice in the 1939/40 season winning one game by 18 points to 13 and the other being drawn 3-3.

Gloucester have had a very successful season and two of their forwards A. Brinn and M. A. Burton are in the England side at the moment. They and Tom Palmer are at National Squad Training this week-end.

They have a number of County players in the side including scrum-half M. Booth, and forwards R. Cowling, M. Nicholls, N. Jackson and Dick Smith, the latter also being an England Trialist. Lock Jim Jarrett is the former Pontypool player, who with several other members of the side has played a number of games for Gloucestershire who are doing extremely well in the English County Championship this season.

Full-back Eric Stephens is the man to watch today. His 4 penalty goals put paid to Newbridge last Saturday, and he performed a similar feat against us in the game at Kingsholm last season when we lost by 12 points to 11.

Bob and Steve Clewes forming the right flank are brothers, and the latter is not yet 20. They are both fine young players with a great future ahead of them.

Gloucester have not lost a game at Kingsholm for 16 months in a run of 39 games, and although somewhat depleted today will be sure to give us a hard fight in our bid to climb back to the top of the Championship Table.

Our renewed congratulations to John Lloyd on retaining the captaincy of the Welsh Team to meet Scotland at the National Stadium on Saturday. We wish him and the team every success in the next step towards another Triple Crown and Grand Slam.

For Bridgend - Viv Jenkins comes in at left centre to partner Tony Morgan who now only needs 11 tries to reach his 200 for the Club which will be a remarkable achievement for this splendid clubman.

Alan Walters is a rota change at scrum-half, resuming a strong partnership with Lyndon Thomas.

Brian Jones reverts to his normal prop position, and Derek Brain will be pleased to get back into action at No. 8 following a groin injury.

The sides' main task today is to restore morale after a couple of disappointing performances, with John Lloyd at the helm to inspire confidence and liven the spirits.
