WELCOME TO THE WIZARDS!

We extend a very warm welcome this afternoon to Aberavon, the famous Welsh "Wizards". It will be of interest to supporters to know that Aberavon were the last Welsh club to beat Gloucester at Kingsholm; that was two years ago. Last season the Cherry and Whites won a closely-contested game at Kingsholm on Saturday, November 21st, 1970, by 9 points to 3, the match being decided on penalty goals, with Eric Stephens landing three for Gloucester.

Next Saturday, of course, is the long-awaited tussle between London Welsh and Gloucester at Old Deer Park in the quarter-final of the Rugby Union national club competition. The following weekend, Saturday, March 11th, brings the County final between Warwickshire and Gloucestershire at Coventry; and with the Schools (19 group) international, England v. Wales, at Kingsholm later in the month, Gloucester officials have more than enough work on their hands at present, so please do not make applications just yet for the other two games. Tickets will be available in due course.

Congratulations once again to Alan Brinn and Mike Burton on retaining their places in the England team for this afternoon's match against France in Paris, though these international honours and the County games have meant that we have seen very little of them at Kingsholm in recent months. These two popular Gloucester forwards are the subject of a full-length article in the March issue of "Rugby World", on sale at all leading bookshops and newsagents, price 17½p.

It is timely, too, to congratulate Dick Smith on his selection for the Barbarians in the annual Mobbs' Memorial match, against East Midlands at Northampton next Thursday. This is indeed a great honour for the club and, of course, for Dick, who has been unlucky so far not to have won an England cap. It appears to have escaped notice, too, that the semi-final against Middlesex last Saturday, was Dick's fiftieth championship for Gloucestershire. A splendid achievement! A.R.
