The cordial welcome we extend this evening our friends from Pontypool is of necessity tinged with a little gloom; for this, of course, is Gloucester's final appearance at Kingsholm in what has been another magnificent season, culminating in the final of the R.U. club champion-

ship final at Twickenham next Saturday week, April 29th.

But, in these valedictory notes of this memorable season, a word or two about our Monmouthshire visitors. On Wednesday evening, November 3rd last, the game at Pontypool Park is still considered by those who saw it as Gloucester's most enjoyable and entertaining this season. Even the fact that the Cherry and Whites won by 29 points to nil seems almost secondary compared with the standard of rugger fare served up that evening.

In contrast Pontypool's last visit to Kingsholm, on Wednesday evening, September 9th, 1970, provided a dour tussle. Neither side had warmed to their task so early in the season and Gloucester only squeezed through by 3 points to nil as the result of a late penalty goal by – believe it or not! – Dick Smith. However, with two such great sides capable of so much, we look forward to a repeat display this

evening of that "spectacular" at Pontypool Park.
