WELCOME TO NEWBRIDGE

We extend a very warm welcome this afternoon to our friends from Newbridge, one of the very few teams to lower the Gloucester colours last season. For it was in the second match, on Wednesday, September 8th, on their own ground that Newbridge narrowly accounted for the Cherry and Whites by 6 points to 3. Gloucester gained revenge in the return match at Kingsholm on Saturday, January 22nd of this year, when they won by 16 points to 6, and we look forward to another enjoyable game today.

The forthcoming big matches at Kingsholm, of course, form the main topic of conversation among rugger types at present, and it is essential to keep supporters informed of the latest moves on these-and, naturally, the allocation of tickets. Those for the Western Counties-All Blacks' game on October 28th are very much at a premium, but a subcommittee is dealing with the problem and it is hoped to announce the position shortly.

Meanwhile, they have sufficient to occupy their minds with the County championship match between Gloucestershire and Cornwall, also at Kingsholm, on Saturday, October 21st. Stand Tickets, at 60p, are now available for this game and application, as usual, should be made to the Gloucester R.F.C. secretary, Mr. Harold King, of 126, Podsmead Road, Gloucester, enclosing remittance and stamped

addressed envelope.

With these two big matches over, there follows the Rugby Union K.O. club competition first round game between Gloucester and Bath. Again, our supporters will be advised when to apply for the stand tickets for this game—the first that Gloucester have played in the competition on Kingsholm. The date is Tuesday, October 31st, with a 7 p.m. kick-off, and supporters are reminded, according to the rules of the competition, that this is an ALL PAY match.

Just in case this does not already appear to be a surfeit of rugger keen enthusiasts may like to know that tomorrow afternoon at Hempsted, (kick-off 3.15 p.m.), Gordon League meet the Bristol side, Ding's Crusaders, in the semi-final of the Gloucestershire County Cup. The other semi-final is between Lydney and Clifton and this will be played at the Lydney ground, Regentsholme, next Saturday afternoon, October 14th.

Even more rugger! Next Wednesday, October 11th, there is the local derby between Gloucester and Cheltenham at Kingsholm, (kick-off 7 p.m.). And the previous evening, Tuesday, October 10th, the all-conquering United lads meet the North Gloucestershire Combination, also at Kingsholm, with the usual 7 p.m. kick-off.
