Honours continue to come Gloucester's way and the latest player to gain recognition is our brilliant young full-back and prodigious place-kicker, Peter Butler, who has been selected for the England Under-23 squad, hence his absence this evening. There has certainly been no lack of top-class rugger fare at Kingsholm this season, and next Wednesday, January 31st, brings yet another "top-priority" game with the staging of the annual international match between the English and Welsh Police, kick-off 7 p.m. Numerous County players and internationals will be on view and it promises to be a spectacular tussle, particularly as the British team to meet the French Police at Richmond next month will be selected after the match.

Next Friday the Cherry and Whites travel to the south of the county to renew battle with their old rivals, Bristol, at the Memorial Ground. Gloucester's next game at Kingsholm is on Wednesday, February 7th, when St. Luke's College will be the visitors, with the usual 7 p.m. kick-off.
