There are few more popular visitors to Kingsholm than our old friends from Bath, to whom we extend an extremely cordial welcome this evening. In the corresponding game at Kingsholm last season Gloucester beat Bath by 24 points to 16 on Saturday, December 11th, 1971, but our Somerset friends' more recent visit was on Tuesday evening, October 31st of the present season, when the Cherry and Whites won by 16 points to nil in the first round of the Rugby Union club knock-out competition. Bath, then will be thirsting for revenge, and we look forward to another entertaining game this evening.
