WELCON TO THE SAINTS!

Possibly some of our supporters may not have realised that this afternoon's match is the first that Gloucester have played on a Saturday at Kingsholm this year—indeed, since December 23rd, 1972. Who better, then, to resume normal and traditional week-end fixtures than our old Midland friends and powerful rivals, Northampton—the Saints—to whom we extend a particularly cordial welcome!

Unfortunately, Northampton and Gloucester only meet once each year, on an alternate home and away basis. It may be recalled that last season, because of the Rugby Union knock-out competition commitments, the fixture at Franklin's Gardens was cancelled, the Saints kindly agreeing to release the Cherry and Whites for that memorable and

glorious game against London Welsh.

Northampton's last appearance at Kingsholm was on March 8th, 1971, when Gloucester won a spectacular match by 25 points to 6. The Saints will be anxious to avenge that defeat and their tremendous form this season suggests they will provide formidable opposition, for they have won 23 and drawn one of their 31 games, amassing 640 points against 378. We look forward to another entertaining match with the Midlanders this afternoon.

Gloucester's next home match is with Guy's Hospital on Saturday, March 17th, but a reminder that United also have a game next Tuesday evening, March 6th—(Budget Day!) when Cinderford are the visitors, kick-off 7 p.m.
