MOSELEY v. GLOUCESTER

GOOD EVENING

Congratulations to the Gloucester club on attaining their Centenary. Over the last 100 years countless Gloucester players have gained the highest honours which the game of rugby football has to offer.

There have been none greater than their President, Tom Voyce, who apart from being the holder of 27 English Caps was a truly great forward during the early twenties, and was President of the Rugby Union during season 1960-61.

Another stalwart is, of course, former International full back, Don Rutherford, who is now an official at Rugby Union Headquarters as the coaching expert.

A particular friend and former Gloucester and Moseley player is the one and only "Digger" Morris, and no doubt we shall see or hear him this evening.

As usual they have made a good start to the season and had a fine victory last week against a remarkably strong International side. They hope to be at full strength and include John Watkins, who played in the historic victory against the All Blacks recently, Mike Burton, full back Peter Butler, who scored over 400 points last season and has already 100 points to his credit, and Palmer, Redwood and Skipper Nicholls to name but a few.

In the Moseley side Hamilton Jones retains his place at full back after a good game at Sale, and of course Sam Doble is not available for mid-week games, Alan Hill is playing for Middlesex in the County Championship and Malcolm Swain returns after injury, in addition John White comes in after an injury at No. 8.

Swain, Cooper, Finlan, Webster and White played yesterday for the Midland Counties against the Japanese and we hope that they will not be suffering from after effects.
