WELCOME TO STROUD

We look forward, then, to another entertaining tussle with our neighbours.

While it became little more than a pleasant romp the overwhelming victory against the Italian touring side, L'Aquila on Monday evening produced some exhilarating, often brilliant rugger from the lads. Smith and Rugby football, particularly in the Stroud area, are virtually synonymous, and it is in his official capacity as the new County president that John has been mainly responsible, not only for the 'new look' Gloucestershire R.F.U. handbook, but also for a monthly publication aimed at a closer association with the County and its affiliated clubs.

And here at Kingsholm the United entertain the strong Coventry Extra 1st XV which is invariably equipped with Internationals and County players. The kick-off for this game is 3.00 p.m.

Gloucester's next match at Kingsholm is a week tonight, Wednesday, September 18, when Abertillery will be our first visitors this season from 'over the bridge', and the kick-off as usual, is at 7.00 p.m.
