Remember all the havoc Attila the Hun caused during his playing career? Well, at the risk of being accused of an excruciating play on words we ominously report that an Italian touring side named L'Aquilla were well and truly Attila-ed this week to the tune of 75-nil.

And the lads responsible for that massacre of the innocents were none other than our visitors this afternoon, Gloucester. Presumably they've prepared themselves for the considerably harder contest they can expect from our Coventry XV.

If the pattern of previous encounters between the two clubs is to hold good, the omens point to a Coventry victory. We've won 11, drawn two and lost only one (in 1966-67) of our last 14 home matches against Gloucester. In the front row, too, there is an abundance of choice with Keith Fairbrother, Jim Broderick, Trevor Corless, Jim Robinson and British Lion Fran Cotton (when he's free from Lancashire county commitments) all in contention.

It's the back row which continues to provide the headaches for our selection committee. Both Barry Ninnes and Alf Troughton have already been pressed into service at No.8 and the emergence of one or other to fill the void left by Les Rolinson and John Barton would be very welcome.
