## PROGRAMME NOTES

### TODAY'S GAME:

After a relatively successful start to the season, we have today our first real test with the visit of Gloucester to Blundellsands. Always a strong club — either they or Coventry have held the National Knockout Cup since that competition's inception — they seem to have brought their strongest side for this game, and we extend our warmest welcome to them on this their first appearance at Blundellsands. Colin Fisher has returned from chasing bear (I think that's right) in the Canadian rockies, with Keith Lunt moving back to flanker, while Jim Deeley comes in at No. 8 for his second game since he came back from Australia with the England Under-19 squad.

Looking at the two sides it's a'most like the Christians and the Lions again (no pun intended). Even in those days, however, the lions did not always come out on top, and if Waterloo can consistently show the spirit today that was so apparent last season, perhaps the game will be closer than might be thought.

Next Saturday we will be at home to Rosslyn Park, kick-off 3.00 p.m., and then the following weekend we have two more hard matches in Dublin against Wanderers and St. Mary's College.
