Always among the most popular visitors to Kingsholm are our old and valued friends, Leicester, the celebrated 'Tigers' to whom we extend a very cordial welcome this afternoon. In their ranks, of course, is someone well known to all our supporters – Robin Cowling, the former Gloucester prop who left the area last season and has joined the Midland club.

Robin, incidentally, was in the Gloucester team which defeated the Tigers by 27 points to 10 when the clubs last met at Kingsholm, on Saturday, January 12 of this year.

Although this was the same day that Gloucestershire accounted for Buckinghamshire in the quarter-final of the county championship the Cherry and Whites rose to the occasion in fine style against their powerful opponents and tries were scored by Bob White (2), Bob Clewes and Stuart Dix, with Stephens converting one and landing two penalties, and Bob Redwood adding a dropped goal.

Oddly enough, only four of the Gloucester players selected for this afternoon's game were in the side that defeated Leicester in January – Bob Redwood, Stuart Dix, Keith Richardson and Alan Brinn. Last Saturday the Tigers only lost to Swansea at St. Helen's as the result of a late penalty goal and we look forward to another enjoyable game this afternoon.

KINGSHOLM KACKLE

Gloucestershire duly began the defence of their County Championship title with a clear-cut win over neighbouring Somerset at Kingsholm last Saturday.

But the County faced a much-improved and determined Somerset side and should be able to look forward with some confidence to their next tussle, against Cornwall at the Memorial Ground, Bristol, next Saturday, November 9. The Social Club is running a special coach to Bristol, for this match, leaving Kingsholm at 1.00 p.m. and returning soon after the game has finished.
