Editorial . . .

Gloucester are finding it difficult to maintain the high standard which they achieved last season. As inevitably happens sooner or later the rebuilding of a side has to be undertaken, and this is the task facing the Gloucester club at the present time.

Last season Gloucester also celebrated their Centenary, but unlike Swansea they failed to win a major competition, nevertheless their 39 victories was a club record.

In the knockout competition between Moseley and Gloucester last Saturday it was a battle of the record breaking full backs, Peter Butler who finished last season with 574 points only seven short of Sam Doble's world record 581. The honours went to Sam Doble's team and sadly Gloucester went out of the cup by the narrow margin of 7 points to 10.

Prop forward Mike Burton was in the England team which beat Wales last season and John Watkins played against France at Twickenham this season.

The Gloucester playing record to date won 22, lost 12, points for 677, against 375.

The Dinner in honour of Swansea winning the Merit Table Championship took place in Cardiff last week. Besides giving great satisfaction to the club it demonstrated the spirit of comradeship which exists between the Merit Table Clubs who at their own expense entertained the Swansea Club.

As expected the Welsh team for the match against England is unchanged, and the good news for Swansea is that Barry Clégg has been picked to join the National Squad.

The fact that rugby has become the most popular spectator sport in France was reflected in the recent France v. Wales match in Paris. Besides being a resounding victory for Wales it produced a record return for a game played in Europe with a sum of £111,000 sterling.
