CORDIAL WELCOME TO THE WELSH POLICE

For this evening's game congratulations go to two of the Club's young players, Rodney Correia, formerly with Matson, and newcomer Wayne Birchley, the Tredworth Colt, who make their senior debuts because of the sudden spate of injuries which has beset the club. They are both highly talented youngsters and we

wish them well this evening, when we look forward to another entertaining game with our Welsh friends.



Injuries

The number of injuries may surprise many supporters, who must be wondering what has happened to some of the regular players. Three of our leading wingers are out of action and may even be finished for the season. Stuart Dix and David Crabbe have shoulder injuries, while vice-captain Bob Clewes, so unlucky this season, has broken a thumb.

Hooker Mike Nicholls suffered badly-damaged ribs in last Saturday's match with Ebbw Vale, when our two redoubtable flankers, John Watkins and John Haines, were also injured to a less serious extent.

Peter Butler, Peter Kingston and Phil Blakeway are nursing swollen arms as a result of these innoculations which they seem to think are so necessary for an Australian tour. In any event, they may be advised not to play again before leaving for 'down under' in little more than a fortnigh't time.



End of Season Games

Signs that the end of the season is in sight is reflected in the fact that next Saturday, April 19, Gloucester play their final home match, with Sale as the visitors to Kingsholm with the usual 3.00 p.m. kick-off. The following Friday there is the recently-arranged away game with Northern, which precedes the Border sevens at Jedburgh to which Gloucester has been invited.
