Yet the sorrow is perhaps eased by the visit of our old friends Sale, whose visits to our fair city and famous ground have been comparatively rare in recent years.

Last season Gloucester travelled to Sale and won by 18 - 3, and two years earlier also gained victory in the north, by 12 - 3. The last match at Kingsholm between the two sides was on Saturday, April 17, 1971, when the Cherry and Whites again triumphed, on that occasion by 28 - 3, so our visitors will be thirsting for revenge this afternoon.

But Sale are in impressive form this season, having won 26 of their 42 matches and scored 657 points. They have recently won both the Wilmslow and Coventry seven-a-side tournaments — in the latter competition accounting for London Welsh in the final by 34 - 20.
