TODAY'S GAME

THE Hertfordshire Rugby Football Union welcome you to Croxley Green this afternoon for the Quarter-Final of the Rugby Football Union County Championship 1975-76.

This is the second successive season that Hertfordshire have won the Southern Division to reach this round. Last year we travelled to Bristol to meet Gloucestershire, also our opponents today, to lose narrowly by 12—15. Gloucestershire went on to win the Championship.

This season we welcome Gloucestershire to our home ground; they were again unbeaten in winning the South-Western Division. They have won the Championship twelve times in their illustrious history, including the last two successive seasons. Indeed they have been finalists for the last six seasons, losing to Staffordshire in 1970, Surrey in 1971 and Lancashire in 1973, and beating Warwickshire in 1972, Lancashire in 1974 (sweet revenge for the previous season) and Eastern Counties in 1975.

We hope this afternoon's game will be an enjoyable one. The winners will be at home in the Semi-Final to the winners of the Northern Division (either Lancashire or Cheshire).
