How gratifying it is to start with congratulations, which we tender to our champions, Gloucestershire — and especially to so many of the "Cherry and White" lads who played the leading part — in crushing Hertfordshire so convincingly at Croxley Green in the quarter-final of the county championship last Saturday!

On to the semi-final, then, which arouses considerable speculation. It is fixed for Saturday, February 7, almost certainly at Bristol, as it is their turn to stage the game, with either Lancashire or Cheshire as our opponents. But these two counties have yet to replay to decide who are winners of the Northern group—and they do not meet until January 31, only a week before the scheduled date of the semi-final..
