Programmes are now on sale for the rugger "spectacular" between Gloucester and an "all-star" XV at Kingsholm on Sunday, November 14. The brilliant players who have accepted invitations to play are already known to supporters, and though injuries can upset calculations when finalising the team there is no doubt that the eventual line-up will be more than enough to whet the appetites of all rugger enthusiasts from near and far.

Admission to the ground for this match is 50p by programme, and stand seats will cost a further "ten bob". A ball autographed by the star-studded visiting team will be the first prize in a competition and all proceeds, of course, will go towards Gloucester's tour of the American state of Colorado next May.

It is estimated that nearly £10,000

is needed for the tour, which spans 18 days and is expected to include five 1st XV matches and two United games. Gloucester's international lock forward, Alan Brinn, who is chairman of the tour committee, says that another competition is also being planned; one that will arouse tremendous interest.
