EDITORIAL . . .

The leading clubs in the West Country are Gloucester and Bristol, great rivals over the years and strong competitors. Gloucester as you would expect regularly supply England with international players. The honour of being the most capped player going to A. T. Voyce who was capped 27 times.

Last season the leading scorers for Gloucester were international full back Peter Butler and Bob Clewes. Butler again passed 450 points in all matches and Clewes scored 32 tries and collected 128 points. An interesting acquisition was the arrival of Chris Williams from Headingly who subsequently gained an England cap as a centre.

Gloucester have recorded some convincing victories this season, beating the Wasps 32 points to 6 and Leicester by 25 points to 10, both victories being achieved away from home.

Last Saturday Gloucester played Bristol in the 2nd Round of the John Player Cup. They won by 12 points to 3 with the Gloucester skipper, international John Watkins, scoring the only try of the game and the accolade of "Man of the Match". Another international in the pack is Mike Burton who has served England well in the front row, and was one of the replacements against Ireland, and will be on duty against France tomorrow.

The Gloucester playing record to date — Won 19, Drawn 3, Lost 9.
