He will be at W. H. Smith's bookshop in Eastgate Street between 12.30 and 1.30 p.m., when he will be autographing copies of his new book.

It will be an opportunity for so many of our supporters to see Gareth in the flesh, as we say, for when he appeared at Kingsholm in the special match—Gloucester v. International XV—two years ago it was so foggy, one recalls, that like most all the players, he was little more than a flitting shadow in the thick fog that enveloped the ground.
