Put the Clocks BACK!

It has been the custom in these notes to remind all supporters at the appropriate time to adjust their clocks and watches at the beginning and end of British Summer Time.

Last season we omitted to include this reminder and duly apologised, for it appears that there were some who forgot to do this small thing until later on Sunday. One, we understand, even went down to his "local" on Sunday morning an hour before it opened.

Forget ye not, then! British Summer Time ends officially at 2 a.m. next Sunday, so put your clocks and watches BACK one hour on Saturday evening. And for those who do not wish to rise too early on Sunday mornings it does, normally, mean an extra hour's "kip".

County Cup Final

Congratulations to our local clubs, Matson and Gordon League, on their recent victories over Stroud and Clifton respectively in the semi-final round of the Gloucestershire R.F.U. Cup competition.

It is further testimony to the strength of local rugby in the city that two of our own junior clubs reach the final in face of formidable opposition from all parts of the county. The date and venue have not yet been decided, but everyone hopes that the final will be at Kingsholm and that whoever wins it will go on to qualify for next season's John Player Cup.

Diary Dates

With so many players in the Gloucestershire side on Saturday the Cherry and Whites have another particularly tough assignment when they travel to the Ireland Avenue ground to meet Nottingham.

Another away game follows on Wednesday, November 1, when Gloucester make the comparatively short journey down the M.5 to meet Clifton at Cribb's Causeway, but the rest of the month brings a series of home matches, commencing with Leicester on Saturday, November 4, kick-off 3.00 p.m.

The match against Cinderford, scheduled for next Monday, October 30, as on all the fixture lists, has now been re-arranged for Monday, December 4, at Kingsholm, kick-off as usual 7.00 p.m.
