Because of the wretched strike by journalists many of our supporters were unaware of the unlucky defeat suffered by the United against Coventry Extra 1st XV at Coundon Road last Saturday. Jerry Herniman and his lads lost by 27 - 17, but they must have fumed over the contrariness of of it all, for they scored three tries, through Mike Teague, Paul Tunstall and Richard Jardine, with full-back Tony Durkin, making his debut, converting one and landing a penalty goal.
