Cordial Welcome to Cardiff

This afternoon we extend a particularly cordial welcome to our old Welsh friends and rivals, Cardiff, of whom so little, alas, has been seen by our supporters in recent years.

Were a "Top of the Pops" survey to be held among rugby clubs, then surely Cardiff would be in contention as the most popular visitors to Kingsholm.

The fixture at Cardiff last season had to be cancelled as both our famous clubs were engaged in their respective national knock-out cup competitions. This year, surprisingly enough, both were unexpectedly eliminated, though current form suggests that neither has been perturbed by cup failures. As though to prove the point Cardiff gained a decisive victory over Swansea last Saturday by 22 points to 10.

Gloucester and Cardiff have been meeting for 97 years and in that long association victory has usually gone with ground advantage. But the Welshmen's last visit to Kingsholm, on Saturday, April 2, 1977, proved one of the exceptions to the general rule.

For, as most of the large crowd who saw that match will readily recall, Gerald Davies scored a brilliant try in injury time to give Cardiff an exciting if slender win by 19 points to 18. It was a memorable finale fully deserving of the ovation given to Gerald by even the most disappointed Gloucester supporters.

Four years ago, however, on Saturday, April 5, 1975, the superiority of the Cherry and Whites was never in doubt, for they romped to victory by 22 points to 3. And it may be of interest to many supporters to know that only Peter Butler, Bob Clewes, Peter Kingston and John Watkins of

our current players appeared in that victorious Gloucester side.

We look forward, then, to another absorbing and entertaining game with our Welsh friends this afternoon, trusting they enjoy their brief stay in our fair city.
