# Welcome to the "Black and Ambers"!

It would be both foolish and hypocritical to deny that Newport have made probably the worst start to a season that even their "elder statesmen" can remember; but vicissitudes of fortunes are inevitable in any club, large or small. Come to that, our own lads have not exactly set the nearby Severn on fire so far this season.

But whatever their record the Newport club is one to be feared and respected and there can be few, if any, more popular visitors to Kingsholm than our old and valued friends from over the border — the "Black and Ambers."

Last season Gloucester can claim to have had the better of matters in the two matches between the clubs. A year ago, on Friday evening, October 20, the Cherry and Whites gained one of their rare victories at Rodney Parade, where they emerged triumphant by 16 - 9 after a closelyfought struggle.

In the return game, on Wednesday, April 25 of this year, Gloucester completed a highly creditable double with success over Newport by 13 - 0 in a match that marked the last appearance at Kingsholm of John Watkins as the club skipper.

This afternoon's match has been generously sponsored by the well-known local company, Messrs. D. A.
