Warm Welcome to Nottingham

Ancient rugby records show that Nottingham met Gloucester at the Spa towards the end of the last century; but their visit to Kingsholm this afternoon is only their fourth since extremely friendly relations were resumed in more modern times.

Hilaire Belloc wrote of the Midlands as "being sodden and unkind" and perhaps we thought that the latter description admirably fitted Nottingham when they made their first appearance here on New Year's Day, 1975, and deservedly won a thoroughly entertaining game by 19 points to 15.

Since then Gloucester have put the overall picture into better focus and gained revenge in the next two matches with home and away victories. Last season, however, Gloucester travelled to Ireland Avenue, where our Midland friends romped to a convincing win by 24 points to 8 on Saturday, October 28.

In reverse, as it were, Nottingham's last visit to Kingsholm two years ago, on Saturday, October 22, 1977, ended in Gloucester securing the verdict by 15 points to 13.

We look forward, then, to another absorbing tussle with our comparatively new Midland friends this afternoon, trusting they enjoy their brief stay in our fair city!
