## Welcome to the Students!

More than a century ago Lord Macauley wrote of giving pleasure to spectators; he was referring to Puritans and bear-baiting, as rugby was one of the erudite pleasures unknown to him,

Nevertheless, these sentiments can still be echoed as we extend a very warm welcome this evening to our popular visitors, Loughborough Students. ("Students", you will note, not the old name of "Colleges"—ours not to reason why!). But, as the Bard wrote, that which we call a rose . . .!

In other words, whatever their nomenclature, the Students' insistence on open and constructive rugby, allied to fitness and finesse, is virtually synonomous with an entertaining and

absorbing game.

Matches with the Students invariably produce high scores as both sides contribute richly to the proceedings, aware that thinking is a prelude to production, not a substitute for it. And, as Samuel Johnson wrote, the great source of pleasure is variety. But perhaps all this might be better recognised in statistics.

Loughborough Students suffered their first defeat of last season when they visited Kingsholm on Wednesday evening. December 6, and the Cherry and Whites won an exciting game by 16 points to 3. They arrive this evening with another exceptionally fine

record.

To date the Students have won eight and drawn one of their 11 matches, with a tally of 253 points to their credit while conceding only 111. Last Saturday they gained an impressive away win over Middlesborough by 12 - 7 and we look forward to another exciting tussle with them. trusting they enjoy their brief stay in our fair city.
