Warm Welcome to The Wizards!

In recent years the national cup commitments of both clubs, and occasionally the weather, have sadly disrupted normal fixtures between Gloucester and Aberavon, the Welsh "Wizards", to whom we extend a very warm welcome this evening.

Even tonight's game is the result of a switch from February 23, when Gloucester met Coventry in the second round of the John Player Cup, and we express our gratitude to our old Welsh friends for so readily agreeing to the change.

Only one of the two normal fixtures between our clubs was possible last season and in that game Gloucester beat the Wizards by 22 points to 10 at Kingsholm on Tuesday evening, November 21, 1978. Earlier this season, on Wednesday, November 21, 1979, the Cherry and Whites visited the Talbot Athletic Ground and were beaten by 12 points to 6 in a keenly contested struggle.

As one of the leading lights in Welsh rugby the Wizards' reputation for placing the emphasis on skilful, constructive moves needs no elaboration and we look forward to another exciting and entertaining game this evening, trusting the Welsh lads enjoy their brief stay in our fair city.

All participating clubs will take a share of the "gate" and the first match is due to kick off at 11.00 a.m., with the final being played about 5.00 p.m.

Don Rutherford, the former Gloucester and England full-back, now the Rugby Union's chief technical administrator, has written a new book entitled "Mini Rugby—It's The Real Thing."

Rugby Union Debentures

The Rugby Union has halved the original cost of its Debenture Scheme, issuing the new price of £345, including V.A.T., over a period of ten years for the Centre Lower and Centre Upper, both West and East, All other stand seats will now cost £230 for the same period.

Those who have already purchased any are offered a refund or may buy further debentures, though they may only be obtained through clubs. Payment may be deferred over 12 months, with a 50 per cent deposit and the remainder a year later.

Forthcoming Fixtures

Gloucester travel to Devon on Saturday to meet Exeter on the County Ground, while the United meet their counterparts from neighbouring Cheltenham at Kingsholm, kick-off 3.00 p.m.

Gloucester Record
