## Warm Welcome to the 'Pool!

For the second successive mid-week game at Kingsholm we extend a very warm welcome to opponents from "over the Bridge" with the visit here this evening of our old friends and rivals from Gwent, the lads from Pontypool.

The 'Pool are enjoying a highly successful season and are vying with Swansea for the title of Welsh league table champions. They have won all but six of their 37 matches to date and have scored no fewer than 886

points while conceding 351.

Pontypool, unfortunately, are only met once each season on a home and away basis and, oddly enough, Gloucester have achieved extremely creditable victories at Pontypool Park where few visiting teams win - in

recent years.

But last season "Ponty" exacted sweet revenge when they beat the Cherry and Whites at the Park by 28 points to 3 on Wednesday evening. October 4, 1978. On the last visit to Kingsholm, on Wednesday, October 5, 1977, Gloucester won an entertaining

game by 18 points to 9.

#### Vital Win at Exeter

Gloucester's victory over Exeter at the County Ground last Saturday was a vitally important result for them; and it was well deserved, particularly as they were without several regular stalwarts.

Defeat by the Devon club would have sent the Cherry and Whites slithering dangerously into fifth position in the South-West Merit Table and as only the top four clubs qualify for next season's John Player Cup competition they could have been in dire straits. For their only two remaining merit table games are Bath (away) — a tough proposition — and the return one with Exeter at Kingsholm,

Now, however, Gloucester share third place with Bath, who have a slight advantage with a better points "for and against" record.

## **Rugby Union Debentures**

The Rugby Union has halved the original cost of its Debenture Scheme, issuing the new price of £345, including V.A.T., over a period of ten years for the Centre Lower and Centre Upper, both West and East. All other stand seats will now cost £230 for the same period.

Those who have already purchased any are offered a refund or may buy further debentures, though they may only be obtained through clubs. Payment may be deferred over 12 months, with a 50 per cent deposit and the remainder a year later.
