

Thorn could not have picked a better year for their initial financial involvement in the Rugby Football Union. English Rubgy took fire for the first time in 23 years. They swept the board by winning the Grand Slam, Triple Crown and the Calcutta Cup. If there had been any further honours up for grabs, they would have won those too because of the team spirit and confidence all directed to the best posssible use by the coaching of Mike Davis.

And, to a large extent, that success was built on the solid foundation of the Thorn County Championship.

The injection of real money into the county scene allowed the teams to prepare far more efficiently than in previous years and none put the cash to better use than the eventual champions Lancashire.

The spin-off of their total Rugby, preached so fervently by their coach Des Seabrook, was vital to England as they provided seven members, including the captain Bill Beaumont, of the national side.

Thorn helped also to inspire a major international success as they helped with the four Divisional matches against the New Zealand touring team.

The North – like Lancashire – made canny use of the extra money. They were the only side to beat the All Blacks. The 21-9 score at Otley on November 17 represented the biggest hiding New Zealand had ever suffered in England.

But Thorn's biggest contribution was to the County Championship. The final between Lancashire and Gloucestershire at the picturesque Vale of Lune ground on February 9 was one of the highlights of a memorable season.

This season, in addition to the Thorn County Championship, There will be the Thorn Divisional Championship. This competition was suspended for the last two years because of touring sides. It will start on December 13 when the North, the holders, meet the South and South West and London tackle the Midlands. All four teams will be in action a week later at Twickenham to decide the 1, 2, 3, 4 order.
