CLUB NOTES

This resulted in dramatic wins at Pontypool and against Leicester when Gloucester scored 6 tries. A clue to the change that has occurred can perhaps be found in the fact that last season Gloucester leading try scorer was Lock forward Steve Boyle with 12 tries; this season so far two three-quarters have already passed that figure.
