ON checking through the records of Newport R.F.C. it is found that today's visitors to Rodney Parade, the Cherry and Whites of Gloucester, first appeared on a Newport fixture nearly 104 years ago, when on 7th December 1878 they held the Black and Ambers, captained by W. Phillips, to a no-score draw.

Since that far-off day the friendships and rivalry between our two Clubs has stood the test of time, although the following breakdown of results clearly indicates how the relevant strength of both Clubs has fluctuated through the passing of time.

Period 1878-1900 Played 35, Newport winning 25, Gloucester winning 5, Draws 5.

Period 1900-1914
Played 26, Newport winning 19, Gloucester winning 2, Draws 5.

Period 1919-1939
Played 39, Newport winning 25, Gloucester winning 13, Draws 1.

Period 1945–1970
Played 50, Newport winning 34, Gloucester winning 13, Draws 3.

Period 1970–1982

Played 24, Newport winning 9, Gloucester winning 13, Draws 2.

Overall Record
Played 174, Newport winning 112, Gloucester winning 46, Draws 16.

Last season Newport won here at Rodney Parade by 29 pts to 10 pts, while Gloucester won at Kingsholme by 19 pts. to Nil. It is certain that the above statistics will make interesting reading for supporters of both Clubs and serve as an inspiration for today's teams.

Welcome, Gloucester — you have already sampled the quality of Gwent previously this season and although you are minus Phil Blakeway and John Gadd, both playing at Twickenham, we know you will be endeavouring to take your total

of wins nearer the half century.
