And this, in spite of the fact, that the old Divisions had temporarily gone by the board, and so it was pure merit which got the sides together so regularly, and at such late stages of the Competition Which goes to show how strong the South West Division had become, in the face of competition from such Counties as Lancashire and Northumberland.

No one here needs reminding of the proud record of Somerset in the Championship - they were runners-up as long ago as 1935, when they lost to Lancashire at Bath.

But the game which most of us remember was the Final at Twickenham in 1984. It was a golden day, when everything went right, including the weather. The result was a surprising 36 - 18 win for Gloucestershire. I say, 'surprising' because, although hot thumbscrews wouldn't have wrung the admission from me at the time, we didn't start as favourites, and in the event, the margin between the two sides wasn't as great as the scoreline suggests

For reasons everyone knows, only two players survive from that triumphant Gloucestershire side. One is Phil Cue, and the other is Simon Hogg, and Somerset will be very well aware that Simon scored one of Gloucestershire's six tries that day.

Games between Gloucestershire and Somerset have always been a feature of West Country Rugby. In fact, I think I'm right in saying that Somerset were the last County to beat Gloucestershire in the old Divisional system, before the short-lived national arrangements were instituted At Bath, as I recall.

A lot of beer has passed over the bridgework since then, and perhaps you may feel, as I do, that not all the changes have been for the better. It is, however, nice to resume Somerset fixtures as part of our own private, West Country scene. Whatever some may say, County Rugby is alive and well as long as Gloucestershire meets Somerset, somewhere along the way.

So the lads from the Cider County are heartily welcome We can't imagine life without them.

One of the problems of writing bits for two programmes only a week apart, is the necessity to avoid repeating oneself. I make no apology, however, for reiterating what I said at Lydney last week: it is nice to be visiting Clubs and Grounds where the County Championship hasn't been seen for yonks.
