SATURDAY FEB. 8 3.00 PM Saracens marvellous effort in beating Waterloo a fortnight ago earned them this tough tie in the fourth round of the John Player Special Cup against Gloucester, one of the favourites to lift the trophy at Twickenham in April.

The combination of several factors makes this an outstanding tie of the round. Saracens are riding high after beating Waterloo when few had given them any hope of success, and furthermore they are top of the John Smith Table B and are having their best season since reaching the semi-finals nine years ago.

Meanwhile Gloucester are looking the most formidable side in the country after a poor start to the season and are in the midst of a run of success which has brought 18 wins out of the last 19, taking them to the top of the John Smith Merit Table A.

Gloucester will be accompanied by a following that no other club in the country could match, and the pure fervour of the cup and Gloucester's fans is reflected in that they are bringing a special train.

The weather in midweek forced tremendous efforts from Saracens, and over 12 tons of straw was strewn across the pitch to keep the frost away, and hopefully enable the game to go ahead on schedule. BBC TV cameras were also approached during the week and offered the

opportunity of screening this match in event of the scheduled game at Litchfield being postponed because of the ice and snow.

Saracens have gone to further efforts of extras bars, in preparing for their biggest gate at Bramley Road for over a decade, and hopefully the match lives up to all the expectations.

Saracens reached this stage of the competition by beating North Waisham, the Norfolk champions, and then Coney Hill from Gloucester in the second round. Then they beat Waterloo in the third round.

They field an unchanged side for the third successive match in what has been a remarkable season after years in the doldrums with their best wins against Richmond, London Welsh, Newbridge, Nottingham, Liverpool, Northampton, and Waterloo.

Gloucester have internationals John Orwin and Mike Teague who has renewed his backrow partnership with John Gadd and Mike Longstaff who were together when they last won the cup.

Gloucester have beaten Leicester and Bristol, and have also beaten Bath. Their leading points scoring is full-back Tim Smith with nearly 200 points, and Derrick Morris has scored 15 tries. Winger Jim Breeze and prop Malcolm Preedy are both injured while Breeze's replacement, Tim Ford scored in their win over Bristol in the last round. In the previous rounds they thrashed Exeter University by a record 87–0 and then beat Lewes.

Saracens have another match at home tomorrow against Met. Police in the Middlesex Cup quarter finals and then the following Sunday are at home to Rosslyn Park in the John Smith B and London Merit Tables.
