

#### TODAY'S VISITORS — GLOUCESTER

Last season Gloucester became the first winners of the John Smith Merit Table A, losing only one of their nine matches that counted in the competition.

Watchers of television rugby will have already seen Gloucester this year when they came into South Wales only to lose in a high-scoring game to Newport.

Through the eighties Newbridge have had the better of the results although many of the games have been very closely contested.

None could have been closer than last season's victory at Kingsholm. Lloyd Davies came out of retirement (for the first time) to help the Bridge to a 12 points to 10 victory. Tim Collins scored a try after just three minutes which was converted by Peter Goodfellow. However by half time the scores were level through two Wickenden penalties. Gloucester then took the lead through an Ian Smith try only for Neil James to score Newbridge's second try while Paul Williams' conversion proved to be the winning maigin.
