GLOUCESTER WELCOME

A happy and prosperous 1987 to you all from the President and Committee of Moseley Football Club.

The New Year at The Reddings starts excitingly with the visit of our friends from Gloucester, a John Smith's Merit Table 'A' game.

Matches between the two teams are usually close. Last year Moseley lost 8–3 at Kingsholm, Breeze scoring two tries but won 18–7 at The Reddings thanks to four penalties and a conversion from Ian Metcalfe and a try by John Goodwin.

Since 1964 the clubs have played 40 games, Moseley winning 15, Gloucester 21 with four drawn, points for 568, against 545.

Gloucester is real rugby country, the team is a town club and supporters can readily identify. Few clubs have a more loyal following as will be seen here today. Happily, suburban Moseley also has its band of loyal supporters, some have cars, coaches and boots and will travel, as was seen at Bedford recently; they went to support the team — not to escape Christmas shopping!

Gloucester's most-capped player is the late Tom Voyce, 27 caps between 1920 and 1926. Not only was he a famous player — he toured with the British Isles to South Africa in 1924 — but also an illustrious administrator, RFU President in 1960. In more recent years Gloucester have provided several England forwards, including Mike Burton, Blakeway, Mills, Fidler, Teague, Watkins, Orwin, this year's captain Malcolm Preedy and, of course, Steve Boyle who toured New Zealand with the Lions in 1983.

Last season Gloucester won the John Smith's Merit Table 'A', losing ony to Harlequins in the nine games played, and had a season winning 32 games and losing 13 with 1,015 points for and 499 against. Derek Morgan scored 27 tries, Jim Breeze 17 and Tim Smith scored 286 points.

Coach Bob Redwood is getting things right with a more settled team, and Gloucester are making a customary recovery this season. After losing 19-11 to Coventry, 12-3 to Bristol and 16-10 to Harlequins in the Merit Table they beat Bath away 12-9. Bath were not far away from full strength; they gained revenge against Coventry 33-6 improving their overall record to 15 wins and 11 losses, scoring over 500 points. After their win against Bristol and the double over Coventry, Moseley are in confident mood, although they lost Colwell and Arutzen injured on Boxing Day. Gloucester too, have run into form - nine consecutive wins, which makes this Merit Table game vital for both sides, just the kind of invigorating encounter to start the New Year.
