Gloucester F.C.

We welcome the players, officials and supporters of one of the great Clubs, Gloucester, founded in 1873, the same year as Moseley, for the first match of the New Year at The Reddings. This is another fixture which brings the best out of both sides whether it be a Courage Clubs Championship match or not, for there has always been a healthy rivalry between the sides over the years. Since 1964, the Clubs have played 45 games, Moseley have won 17, Gloucester 24 with 4 drawn, scoring 639 points with 637 against.

It is difficult to judge the strength of teams these days when looking at their overall record at any given point in the season for, in non league games, players are often rested and then there are Division and International calls. However, such is the strength of Gloucester's reserves that their record to 18/12/88 still looks good - played 21, won 15, drawn 1, lost 5 scoring 538 points with 255 points against. Gloucester are lying third in the Courage Clubs Championship National Division One winning 4, drawing 1 and losing 2 games. In the last two games in the Championship, they lost 10-11 at home to Bristol and drew 15-15 at Waterloo. Their other defeat was at Bath 9-19. Last Saturday (17/12/88) Gloucester won at Coventry 30-14 aithough without their entire front row, Malcolm Preedy, Kevin Dunn and Richard Pascall and Mike Teague, Ian Smith, and Marcus Henniford, all in the South West Division squad. Moseley lost heavily to Gloucester 37-9 in their first Courage Clubs Championship match of the season at kingsholm, Gloucester scoring 5 tries to Moseley's none. Moseley last beat Gloucester on January 1st, 1987 in a John Smith's Merit Table game at The Reddings 15-10.

Whatever the make-up of the teams for today's game, Moseley have a difficult match, but a win would give the team confidence for the stern task ahead in the Courage Clubs Championship. Gloucester, on the other hand, will be keen to keep up the impetus in the hope that they can finish runners-up to Bath who look unbeatable at the moment.

So, a keen game is in prospect which should provide an invigorating start to the New Year.
