Tonight's visitors are the Gloucester team, officials and supporters and we extend a very warm welcome to them.

Under the captaincy of scrum half, Marcus Hannaford, Gloucester are enjoying a successful season and are currently doing well in the Courage Club Championship. Their latest game in the championship was against Leicester at Kingholm last Saturday, when the visitors were crushed 28 - nil. This makes tonight's game look like an uphill struggle for Pontypool. Indeed if Pontypool should win tonight it would be a notable victory. Gloucester's Courage Championship record reads:- played 8, won 5, drawn 1, lost 2.

Tonight's game is Gloucester's ninth against Welsh opposition this season. They have beaten Swansea and Ebbw Vale at Kingholm and Pontypridd at Sardis Road. Full back, Tim Smith is a reliable place-kicker and is approaching the 200 points mark for the season. Centre, Rory Maclean played in the recent Scottish trial and will probably play for Scotland some time in the not-too-distant future.

Gloucester can field a couple of capped players. Back row men, John Gadd has played for the England 'B' team while Mike Teague has won a couple of full caps.

Derek Morgan, Nick Price and Jim Breeze share the wing positions while Richard Mogg is Maclean's regular partner at centre. Mike Hamlin is the established outside half in the team. Up front, Malcolm Preedy, Kevin Dunn and John Etheridge are among their more experienced performers so it is easy to see why our visitors are enjoying a successful season.
