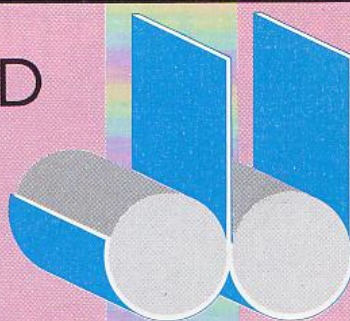

A warm welcome back to The Reddings to Moseley members and supporters at the commencement of another season. There has been much strenuous activity at The Reddings since June 1st as the players have entered wholeheartedly into the demands of the new coaching structure under Head Coach Derek Nutt, and John Beale and Keith Bonsor. And the arrival of new players has aroused further stimulus so that although miracles don't happen in five minutes, there is a feeling of anticipation of an improved performance to come. 9-55 at the Gnoll! you may say but, in short, Neath gave an All-Black performance in keeping with their all black strip.

WELCOME TODAY'S VISITORS — GLOUCESTER F.C.

In the deep end once more, Moseley welcome **Gloucester** today in their first Courage Clubs Championship Division 1 game of the season. A great Club founded in the same year as Moseley — 1873, Gloucester finished 2nd to all-conquering Bath last season, and in the corresponding game last year at Kingsholm won 37-9 scoring 5 tries to Moseley's nil.

Gloucester are captained this year by out-side half Mike Hamlin who played for England 'B' against Spain last May. The former Cheltenham player has struck up a fine partnership with scrum-half Marcus Hannaford and cannot be far away from a full England cap. They are coached by Keith Richardson, a former Gloucester and Bristol prop who is also coaching the South West Division.

There does not seem to be much in the way of comings and goings at Gloucester except of course for Ruari McLean's move to Moseley. A talented Scotland 'B' centre he has taken up a teaching post in Birmingham after touring Japan with Scotland last May. He is replaced at Gloucester by Don Caskie formerly of London Scottish and Paul Taylor who has returned from Mozambique. In a redoubtable pack, hooker Kevin Dunn and lock John

Etheridge also played for England 'B' in Spain (as did our own Mark Linnett) and special congratulations are due to Mike Teague on winning the Player of the Series Down-Under with the Lions.

After that performance, there is some feeling of relief that he will not be fit for today's game but the strength of Gloucester's squad is such that his replacement is bound to be of high calibre, and the pack will be as formidable as ever.

A special mention for the admirable Richard Mogg, a high quality back whose play is always enjoyed at Moseley — except when he scores against us!

At the time of writing Moseley are choosing from a squad of 18. Included are Adam Wheatley, Laurence Boyle and Chris Spowart who made their 1st XV debuts against Neath last week. Derek Nutt will have told his team to forget last week's result — just learn from the mistakes.

And so in the opening 1st XV game at The Reddings this season, the adrenalin will flow in players and spectators alike. We hope for an enjoyable game and whatever the result, let conviviality reign in the Clubhouse afterwards.
