MOSELEY v GLOUCESTER on Tuesday January 1st 1991

The President and Committee of Moseley Football Club wish our players members, sponsors, supporters and our visitors here today a very happy and rewarding New Year.

A warm welcome to the players, officials and supporters of the 'cherry and whites, Gloucester, to The Reddings this afternoon for what is becoming a traditional New Year's Day game between the two clubs.

This is another fixture which especially when it is played on the 1st January, brings the best out of both teams and creates its own atmosphere of excitement for what we hope will be a large crowd who have enjoyed the festivities and want a breath of fresh air. There has been a long-time healthy rivalry between the two clubs both founded in 1873. Since 1964, the Clubs have played 49 games, Moseley winning 18 Gloucester 27 and 4 have been drawn, Moseley scoring 690 points with 719 against. Moseley's last win against our visitors was here on New Year's Day 1989 21-3 when, it must be admitted, Gloucester fielded a below strength team, four wingers in the threequarters. Peter Shillingford scored a pushover try and one in the last minute after Paul Suckling had been tackled short of the line,. Steve Lloyd scored a try receiving from Richard Denhardt and Carl Arntzen converted one try and kicked three penalties. Tim Smith replied with a penalty goal for Gloucester. One unusual happening, George Seddon, the referee, did not arrive in time and the match was taken over by the North Mids ref, Steve Griffiths. He, however, pulled a muscle in the second half and was replaced by the aforementioned Mr Seddon. We hope the ref has better luck in today's game. Since that game Gloucester won a closely fought Courage Clubs Championship game here 16-12 and last New Year's Day Gloucester won 33-4 at Kingsholm, the rampant Gloucester side outplaying Moseley

in heavy conditions and continuous rain. Nick Price (2), Tim Smith, Ian Smith, Kevin Dunn and their captain Mike Hamlin scored tries. Bobby Barr scored a try for Moseley, scant reward for their strenuous efforts to stem the tide. This season, Gloucester although inconsistent, found their form in the second half of the Clubs Championship game at Kingsholm and won 30-12 after Moseley had led 6-3 at half-time. Ian Stooksbury scored an apportunist try for Moseley converted by Carl Arntzen who also kicked two penalties. Derek Morgan (2), Nick Marmont, Marcas Hannaford and Damien Cummins scored tries for Gloucester, Tim Smith converting two and kicking two penalties.

At the time of writing thw writer has no idea of the make-up of the teams appearing today because of the holidays. However it is interesting to surmise as to whether four players who have represented the Anglo-Scots in the S.R.U. District Championships will be on the field today, Damien Cummins and Don Caskie of Gloucester and Ruari McLean and the black country scotsman Graham Smith of Moseley. No doubt they were involved in the match against Glasgow District last Saturday buthave they got over the Hogmanay celebrations? Or they may be involved in the Scottish international Trials.

Moseley expect to welcome Robin Taylor back after injury. Whatever the make-up of the teams today, Moseley have a difficult match but a win would maintain the confidence of the team for the stern Courage Clubs Championship matches ahead, and Gloucester too will be keen to maintain their improved form.

So an invigorating start to the New Year is in prospect. An enjoyable second part of the season to you all. They also serve that only stand and support.
