Bristol have played more games against Gloucester than any other side, with the exception of Bath. Todays match is the 181st meeting since the first game, played at Gloucester on 24th September 1892. On that occasion Gloucester won 14 pts—nil, scoring 3 tries and 2 drop goals.

Bristol found success hard to come by in the early years, particularly at Gloucester. So the victory they recorded there on 4th October 1924 was particularly enjoyable. Gloucester were able to field their strongest team for the first time that season, and the two set of forwards fought a hard battle. Tries by Reg Quick (2) and Len Corbett, with a Reg Pickles penalty saw Bristol home 12 pts.—10, to give them victory at Gloucester for the first time in 17 years.

Bristol enjoyed overwhelming superiority in the home match on 3rd February 1962. They dominated all areas of the game, and had they had a reliable goal kicker the scores would have been much greater than 23 pts.—nil. Indeed Bristols only successful kick at goal came from prop. John New. It was his only successful kick in 105 first XV appearances! John Blake dropped a goal and tries were scored by Mike Ellery (3), Len Davies, David Weeks and Alan Godson.

Bristol suffered their heaviest defeat at the Memorial Ground on the 27th April 1977. The game marked the farewell of two outstanding servants of the Bristol Club, Dave Rollitt and Dave Tyler. Rollitt made 414 appearances for the club scoring 101 tries, and Tyler scored 153 tries, 4 conversions, 5 penalties and 3 dropped goals in 425 appearances. Both men captained the side for 2 seasons.

Gloucester unfortunately failed to read the script and took full advantage of a subdued Bristol side. They scored tries by P. Howell (2), D. Pointon and B. Clewes. Peter Butler kicked 4 penalties and 3 conversions. Bristol could only reply with 3 penalties by Phil Cue to give a final scoreline of 9 pts.—34.

REPLAY — Bristol v Gloucester — 24/9/1983

Matches between Bristol and Gloucester are always keenly contested affairs and this was no exception.

The Bristol side contained two nineteen year old players making their senior debuts, Matthew Skuse at Lock and Simon Roberts at Fly-half, sadly both players appeared to be out of their depth at this level.

Simon Roberts was standing in for the injured Simon Hogg.

Bristol made all the early running with Ralph Knibbs taking the role of kicker and were soon leading by 12 points to 3, a Huw Duggan try converted by Knibbs plus two penalties by Knibbs to a penalty by Tim Smith for Gloucester.

Gloucester then hit back with a fine try by captain Sargent which Tim Smith converted to cut the deficit to 12—9 and by the 54th minute had gone into the lead with two further penalties both kicked by Smith. A Nick Price try in the 68th minute completed the scoring and Gloucester had won by 19 points to 12.
