TODAY'S GAME.

We are very pleased to welcome the players, officials and supporters of GLOUCESTER R.F.C. to Brooklands for today's game. The club was founded in 1873 and has a long and distinguished history. Their most capped players include Mike Teague, (now with Moseley), Tom Voyce and Don Rutherford. Since the inception of the Courage Leagues, they have enjoyed Division One status throughout and have not finished a season below sixth position. A fine record by any standards. They have not yet managed to win the championship but were runners up in the 88/89 and 89/90 seasons. Last year they finished in fourth place.

The 1992/3 league campaign has been disappointing so far. Gloucester currently occupy eighth position in the table having won three and lost four of their seven games played to date. They started the league season with two away defeats. Against London Scottish they lost by 8 points to 3 and at Leicester by the narrowest of margins, 22 - 21.

A win against Rugby at Kingsholm by 21 - 12 gave them their first league points but defeats against Wasps (14 - 9) and West Hartlepool (21 - 6) dealt their championship aspirations a severe blow. Wins against Saracens (19 - 5) and away at London Irish (18 - 6) have been encouraging and raised hopes for an improvement in the second half of the season.

Sale and Gloucester have enjoyed many exciting matches over the years and our visitors have the better overall record. The clubs have played each other on 35 occasions and Sale's best period was between 1950 and 1960 when we won six of the seven games played - 5 away at Kingsholm!

Gloucester gave us a lesson in the 1988 Courage League game when we suffered our biggest defeat by 61 points to 7. The clubs met again at Kingsholm in April 1990 and this time Sale won by 21 points to 16.

This season's earlier encounter produced a win for the Cherry and Whites. Sale led 3- 0 at half time thanks to a Phil Jee penalty but Gloucester began to dominate the second period and tries from Martyn Roberts and Jerry Perrins gave them the initiative, despite a late consolation try from Mark Warr. Martyn Roberts kicked both conversions and a penalty and Phil Jee added Sale's only other points from a penalty kick to leave the scoreline reading 17 - 11 to the home side.

I am sure that we can expect another close fought match today and whatever the result we will show our visitors the usual Heywood Road hospitality afterwards in the clubhouse.
